Bookings are not required....just be at the bus stop at 9am ready to board. This pilot program will commence Thursday 1st October. Initially the bus will be the primary school bus driven by Sim Ayres.

The Strathbogie Tableland Action Group (STAG) with support from the Strathbogie Council is launching this pilot program over the next year to test the need for and usage of a regular community bus for our region.

An Interview with Strathbogie CFA Captain Dana Last



What first attracted you to joining the CFA?

I had a friend who was in the CFA, he would tell awesome stories of fighting fires. I also think it is an important part of living in the bush and worthy cause to give my time to. I thought that joining the CFA would be the best way to learn how to survive bushfires.

How long have you been a member?

13 years

What are the main requirements for becoming a CFA member?

Be willing and able to help and have a generous dose of common sense.

Which emergency services does Strathbogie CFA provide?

We put fires out primarily. We can also be called to motor vehicle accidents and all sorts of rescue events.

How far will the Strathbogie CFA travel to provide these services?

Our local region is quite small and mostly occurs on the Tableland, but for larger fire campaigns we can be deployed across the state and even across the country.

For you, what are some of the satisfying aspects of being a CFA member?

The camaraderie, the feeling of working together for a greater good, protecting our community, and driving the big red truck.

For you, what are some of the challenging aspects of being a CFA member?

Some situations you find yourself in you really need to think outside the square and communicate in a clear manner whilst remaining calm.

Do you see women as having a greater role in the CFA in the future?

I can't see a reason why not. I would love to buck the statistic of less than 3% women in brigade management roles. If so, how might this come about? Just by being involved, being the token female so others might step up too. It is working too. Last fire I went to there were 4 females out of the ten fireys that attended the incident.

What has your path to becoming a CFA Captain been?

I turned up, then I kept turning up and they made me a lieutenant. But it was after I attended the first NE Womens Challenge Camp when I decided to go for captaincy. The speakers were so inspiring, and they paved the way for me to step up.

Where has your mentoring come from?

CFA have a group called Women In Leadership which runs a mentoring program that hooked me up with Tracey Johnston, captain of Mallacoota fire brigade. Tracey and I have been communicating for about a year now. Of course, our outgoing captain David Hamilton has been guiding me through the role as well.

What do you see as your priorities as a new CFA Captain?

Make it through the fire season and learn how to do the job of captaincy whilst remaining true to myself. I would like to prioritise training and manage health/wellbeing of our brigade. In the bigger picture I would love to see Strathbogie Brigade in a new fire shed, with an Honour Board.

Is there anything else you would like to add about your personal experience as a CFA member and / or how the team works together?

It is a real honour to serve this community in a brigade that has made me feel so proud to be a part of.

Longwood Fire Learnings

Last summer there was a major bushfire on the Strathbogie Tableland doorstep originating in Longwood.

What was your role during this fire?

I was crew leader on 9 turnouts over the course of the fire. I also was helping during crew change overs, inevitably instigating informal debriefs as crew wound down from the shift.

Briefly summarise the nature of this fire. Was it different to other recent local bushfires? If so, how?

It was huge, so huge that you often felt like you were working on some tiny insignificant bit of a giant beast of a fire. Because of its size, the campaign went on for much longer than any local fire I have experienced. Then because it went on for so long there were lots of different weather patterns and topography encountered.

What review processes have taken place since?

On a brigade level we had several informal debriefs during the fire and a multi brigade after action review a few weeks after. CFA have been investigating and there were also enquiries in our state parliament over the management of this fire.

What learnings have come from the Longwood fire from a local and wider perspective?

Things are still coming to the surface on this one as it is a long, slow process to make changes to on a wider perspective. However, I would like to think that because Strathbogie so narrowly escaped the fire, we as a community would be more prepared for bushfire events this season... Come along to our **Bushfire Sunday** and learn about how to get fire ready!

Have changes been made to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of emergency responses locally and more widely? If so, what are they and how have they come about?

Like most large organisations new people have taken on different and new roles in all aspects of CFA management since the Longwood fire. We will see how things work out with these new players in the fire seasons ahead.

Strathbogie Fire Brigade Report

August saw three members of our fire brigade, including myself, successfully complete the CFA course Respond to Isolated Structure Fire. The course included a day of practical training at the Victorian Emergency Management Training Centre (VEMTC) in Wangaratta, where we were able to safely practise a range of fire scenarios.

September is a great time to review your fire plan or create a new one if you haven't already. Circumstances can change, so it's important to keep your fire plan up to date. Some things to consider include what your triggers for evacuation might be, such as a predicted Total Fire Ban or Catastrophic Fire Danger Day. If your plan is to stay and defend your property, it's also worth considering whether you are currently physically capable and mentally prepared for the task. 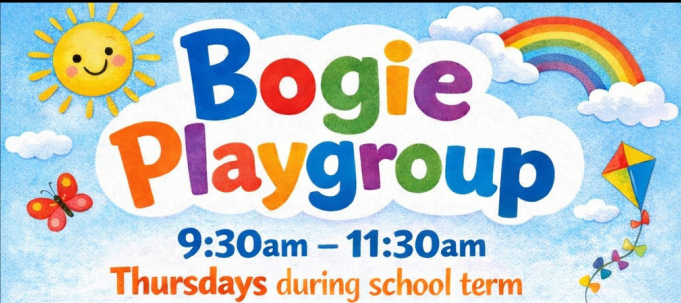

Is the Grazing Management of your paddocks more important than fertiliser or lime - for healthy pasture?

Field Day – Friday 9th October 26 at 10.30 until 12.00 noon

Better pasture comes as a result of better soil, as well as better soil and pasture management. And, those wanting to grow and fatten livestock will realise that good pasture is the cheapest form of livestock feed !!

So, over the past 6 years, Strathbogie Landcare has been running a trial to grow better pasture, in a paddock that was weed infested and with highly acidic soil. We divided the trial site up so that we could test a number of options:

- Would a heavy dose of lime make a big difference to the soil pH ?

- Would deep ripping of the soil help to get lime deeper into the soil profile ?
- Could we spread enough lime to bring the pH to more neutral levels ?
- Would a legume crop grown on the site and then disced into the soil help once perennial grasses were planted ?
- Are there grasses that can withstand highly acidic soil and still thrive ?
- Does limited grazing and resting of a paddock make a big difference to pasture establishment and vigour ?

The results of this ongoing trial have really surprised us. Our number 1 conclusion is that it is too costly to try to make any substantial difference to the pH - so the best option is to work with the soil you have.

Come along on 9th October and see the results of this trial site including:

- ☐ The different soil treatments applied to the site at the commencement of the trial in 2021
- ☐ The use of Lime applications
- ☐ The pasture mix that was sown in 2021
- ☐ The Grazing Management applied to the site over the past 6 years
- ☐ Comparison between this trial site and the adjoining paddock which has been 'traditionally' grazed over the same 6 years.
- ☐ Conclusions about our findings (so you don't have to 'reinvent the wheel')

If you want to get the most out of your paddocks (and therefore healthier, faster growing livestock) then there are some very worthwhile conclusions from this trial.

Community invited to review final draft Urban Growth Strategy

Strathbogie Shire residents are being invited to have their final say on a revised draft Urban Growth Strategy that will help guide future township growth and housing across the municipality. The final draft Urban Growth Strategy (UGS) is now on public exhibition, providing the community with a final opportunity to review the document and provide feedback before it is considered by Council for adoption.

Mayor Cr Scott Jeffery said the revised draft reflects extensive community feedback, technical investigations and recommendations from the Community Panel. "People consistently told us they want growth coordinated with infrastructure and services while protecting environmental values and the character of our towns. They also shared a range of views about township growth and future housing opportunities."

The Urban Growth Strategy provides a long-term framework for managing growth across Strathbogie Shire. It refines township growth boundaries, prioritises development on existing serviced land, reduces previously identified growth areas affected by infrastructure or environmental constraints, and identifies targeted opportunities for future growth in locations including Nagambie and Violet Town.

Adoption of the strategy would not automatically rezone land or approve development. The Urban Growth Strategy provides strategic direction for future planning. Any future changes to the Planning Scheme would be subject to a separate statutory process, including further community consultation and opportunities for public submissions.

Council is now seeking feedback on the revised strategy before it is presented for final consideration. The final draft Urban Growth Strategy will be on public exhibition from 21 September to 19 October 2026. To review the document and provide feedback, visit share.strathbogie.vic.gov.au.

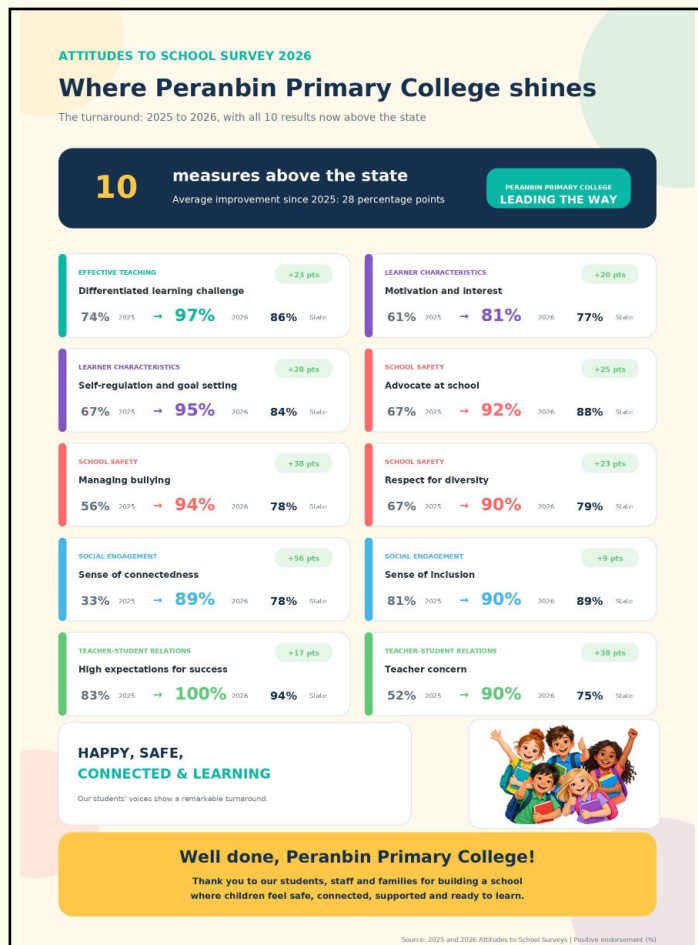


Peranbin Primary School News +++

Recipe of the Month

Rhubarb Coconut Cake

Ingredients

- 10 sticks of rhubarb chopped to 1cm lengths
- 125g melted butter
- 3 lightly beaten eggs
- 1 1/2 cup of milk
- 1 1/2 cups of caster sugar
- 1 1/4 cups coconut

Demerara sugar

1 1/2 cups self raising flour

Method

Preheat oven to 180 degree C. Combine flour, sugar and coconut. Stir in melted butter, eggs and milk. Spread half the cake mix into a large cake tin. Scatter half the rhubarb over the mix. Add the remaining cake mix. Scatter the other half of the rhubarb. Sprinkle with the Demara sugar. Bake for 1 1/4 hours or until brown and a skewer comes out clean.

FUEL CELL INFORMATION SESSION



Are you interested in buying fuel locally, but not sure how the Fuel Cell at the Rec Reserve works?

In the past have you tried using the Fuel Cell & not been able to figure out how to operate it properly?

Have the posts on Bogie-tree from people having trouble using the Fuel Cell turned you off using it?
